<i>2nd</i>	<i>3</i>	<i>Dha Tin Tin Ta</i>	<i>Clap (5)</i>
<i>3rd</i>	<i>4</i>	<i>Ta Dhin Dhin Dha</i>	<i>Wave (8)</i>
<i>4th</i>	<i>3</i>	<i>Dha Tin Tin Ta</i>	<i>Clap (12)</i>

*The sam (first beat) and khali (empty beat) create the natural rise and fall in the rhythmic flow — a dance of sound and silence that gives Deepchandi its characteristic beauty.*

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### 4. Deepchandi Toda – A Stunning Composition

*A toda is a short, rhythmic composition or flourish that tabla players perform to mark the end of a rhythmic cycle or to showcase skill. Here's a traditional Deepchandi Toda example:*

***Dha - Trkt Dha - Trkt Dha Trkt Dha - Trkt |  
Dha - Trkt Dha Trkt Dha - Trkt Dha - Trkt |  
Dha - Trkt Dha Trkt Dha - Trkt Dha - Trkt Dha!***

***Played at moderate speed, this toda captures the lyrical and balanced nature of Deepchandi. Its repetition of Trkt (a rapid triplet phrase) gives it texture, while the final Dha on the sam (first beat) lands with authority and satisfaction.***
